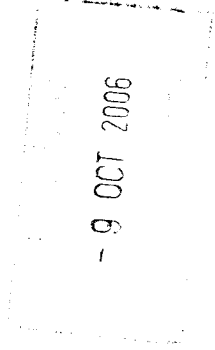



Dear Gerard

It gives me great pleasure, again, to write and thank The Dave Owen & Frank Goodall Memorial Fund for supporting Marie Curie Cancer Care. Please find a receipt for £2846 enclosed which is earmarked for our Research Institute. This is a major donation and I can assure you it will be put to good use, in memory of Dave and Frank.

Can I thank everyone who took on the challenge of the 3 Peaks Walk? I hope there weren't too many injuries as you walked and you all enjoyed the experience!! I hope you get the opportunity to thank everyone, on behalf of Marie Curie Cancer Care, who sponsored you to take on this challenge. The following paragraphs have been sent to me by someone at the Institute which, I hope gives a flavour of our work and how important it is to the scientific community. We wouldn't be able to do this if it wasn't for the support of events like yours.

"This year has been a busy and exciting year for the Marie Curie Research Institute. We have continued to produce research of the highest calibre resulting in a number of front rank publications in journals such as Nature and Cancer Research. We have also expanded the Institute with the arrival of Dr Andrew McAinsh from MIT to establish the Chromosome Segregation Laboratory. The MCRI now consists of 60 Scientists working in 8 teams towards solving the cancer problem. We have also continued to add to our state of the art equipment with the installation of a new Deltavision Digital Deconvolution Microscope.

We have had many individual highlights during the past year, The Cell Cycle Control Laboratory, led by Dr Hiro Yamano, have made significant advances in their work on potential new roles for APC/C and its involvement in cell cycle progression in collaboration with scientists at the CRUK Institute for Cancer Studies. This group has also undertaken collaborative work with the laboratory of Masayuki Yamato at the University of Tokyo. The Cell Signalling and Development Laboratory led by Dr Colin Goding have continued with impressive results dissecting the molecular networking involved in the development of melanoma. The Molecular Motors team led by Dr Rob Cross probed the stepping behaviour of kinesin by using optical tweezers to push and pull on a single kinesin molecule. When they pulled strongly enough, kinesin could be made to walk backwards in a sustained manner. This dramatic result has transformed thinking regarding

molecular mechanisms of kinesins and, as suggested in the accompanying Nature News and Views could provide the basis for developing a motor to drive nanoscale molecular machines". It all "goes over my head". As well as these pieces of information I must tell you that we have one of the world's experts on the study of melanoma.
